Keeping Safe

The safety of our members is the number one priority for Foggy Bottom West End Village. We recognize that older adults, especially those with health issues are at highest risk for Covid. To that end, we are maintaining our policy requiring masks for all indoor events when not eating or drinking and requiring proof of full vaccination including a booster shot before attending any in-person event.

Because the latest variant is more contagious than previous variants we are taking an extra step to increase everyone's sense of confidence that village events are as safe as possible. We are asking everyone who attends indoor events where you will be taking your mask off in order to eat or drink to please take a rapid home test for Covid before attending the event. We will not be asking



for proof of a negative test – this will be on the honor system.

We have test kits available at the office and can drop one off at your home or you can make arrangements to come by the office to pick it up. To stop by the office or to request that a kit be delivered to your home just send a note to info@fbwevillage.org or call us at 202-333-1327. If you're unsure how to use the test kit, we can walk you through the process. Like many things, it's very easy once you get familiar with it and we can help make you familiar.

Although the West End Library is closed at present due to flood damage, <u>click here</u> to see other libraries and test kits pick up locations and their real time supply of test kits.

Thanks for helping to keep yourself and other village members as healthy as possible.





- If you have any problems with registering for an event online, please call the Village office at (202) 333-1327 and someone will be able to register you for the event.
