Some of you may recall our participation in a survey last summer. A new survey has been developed, again for all 13 DC Villages, which we will send out in mid-June. This survey is paid for by a grant that Capitol Hill Village receives and all DC Villages have provided input for the survey. There will also be several questions at the end of the survey that are specifically for FBWEV members.



As with last year's project, all participating villages will receive a report showing the compiled results for all 13 of the District's villages. Each village will also receive the survey results from their own village.

The results of last year's survey were very helpful as we moved forward planning programs and services. Especially in light of the ongoing situation with Covid, the survey helped us decide when and how much to "open" for in-person activities. It also played an important role in developing our strategic plan for upcoming years.

She has painted the lives of refugees,




street performers, prisoners and many more. With her unique canvas shape and layered brushstrokes, she tells the stories of those who have been historically invisible or hidden.

Georgia O' Keeffe is one of America's most prolific modern painters. Known for her paintings of flowers, New York

skyscrapers and New Mexico landscapes, she is often called the Mother of American Modernism.

As a hardworking professional, she rejected the gendered interpretations of her work and forged a new path for herself, using photography, Modernist ideas, and aesthetics of Asian art as her inspiration. She helped to establish a new and significant space for female artists in a realm that has often been dominated by men.

The works highlight art's potential to respond to adversity and promote positive change in a wide range of media, including painting, drawing, photography, sculpture, textiles, video, and performance. The tour will be led by Villager/ NPG docent Lorna Grenadier. Note: Outwin First Prize winner Amy Sherald painted the official portrait of First Lady Michelle Obama for the NPG's permanent collection.




Join the Mayor's Office of LGBTQ Affairs and DC Public Library on

- You will receive an event confirmation email. If you do not get this email, you are not registered. Please call the Village office at (202) 333-1327 and someone will be happy to help.
- For some programs, you will use a personal email to register. Just email the person listed and let them know you plan to attend.
- If you have any problems with registering for an event online, please call the Village office at (202) 333-1327 and someone will be able to register you for the event.
